MESSAGE FROM THE President & Ceo

Last year we improved thousands of lives across the Silicon Prairie through our career development and educational programs. We are proud to serve our community at every step along the way. As you know, AIM is the hub of the Silicon Prairie--a vibrant ecosystem of technology experts, leaders, start-ups, tech educators and corporate giants. And while our region continues to garner well-earned attention from the national tech industry, AIM continues to play a key role in attracting more jobs and technology-based businesses to our region. We make what's good about Omaha's tech community even better.

AIM ignites a lifelong pathway of opportunity in technology for individuals from all walks of life, from underserved and underrepresented youth to adults who need to change careers to remain employable. In addition, we strive to serve organizations by finding talent, managing technology, and connecting to relevant resources. The result? AIM benefits hundreds of thousands of students, career seekers, professionals, and companies through our youth programs, online talent recruitment portal, and professional programs that help people of all ages stay on the leading edge of a changing digital landscape.

We do this because we refuse to accept the status quo. As new inventions and new platforms reshape and reinvent our society, technology remains one of the most dynamic sectors of our economy. Employment in the tech industry is growing at twice the rate of the national average, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Median wage for these jobs is more than twice the median annual wage for all occupations.

Locally, however, AIM has identified a shortage of almost 1,200 technology workers, with an estimated loss of more than \$102 million to the region's businesses and residents as a direct result of this shortfall. (Unfortunately, these are conservative estimates, and they alarm us.) A recent Omaha World-Herald article dedicated to the local tech workforce crisis quoted Nebraska Chamber of Commerce and Industry President Bryan Sloane in no uncertain terms: "This is now the most pressing economic issue in the state." The crisis will only compound in coming years. The UNO Center for Public Affairs Research has found that the prime-age workforce here peaked in 2018 and is set to decline over the next decade.

But all is not lost. AIM is more committed than ever to turning the tide for Omaha's businesses and for its youth and adults who seek meaningful and rewarding careers in technology. We offer programming that starts as young as age seven and continues through adulthood. Although we face a fewer total number of workers on the horizon, AIM works diligently to ensure that the proportion of skilled tech workers will be higher than ever before.

Since AIM was founded, we have been helping talented people stay in Omaha and achieve the simple dream of living a good life. More than 142,000 youth have been served through our education programs; 11.1 million job seekers have applied for jobs with our assistance; 16,438 attendees have participated in our events; and more than \$14 million dollars have been raised for technology and the arts.

I'm proud to see how far AIM has come in the past 26 years. With our multitude of programs and events serving individuals and businesses from all ages and all facets of the Silicon Prairie, we have created a diverse tech ecosystem here. We are truly a catalyst for the community.

My passion for the work AIM does stems from my personal experiences. From the start of my career here, I was mentored. Working at AIM was fun, engaging, and enriching. That hasn't changed, even today.

My personal mission with AIM is to ensure that individuals have the same great experience that I have had. Our goal today, and going forward, is to do all we can to help build a robust tech talent community and enhance the lives and careers of as many people as possible.

We are grateful for all of the support we have received from businesses, partners, collaborators, foundations, and individual donors. Without your help, we could not have improved so many lives and positively impacted our economic landscape. Our commitment to you is to ensure that the Silicon Prairie region continues to be the dynamic, growing tech hub for current and future generations.


TWO LOCATIONS PROVIDING SERVICES

Formerly the Omaha Grain Exchange, the building has been one of the pillars of Omaha's business community dating back to 1916.

2018'S RECORD OF **SUCCESS**

AIM Institute is the only nonprofit dedicated to building a connected community for tech talent. For more than 26 years, we have engaged with our community partners to provide life-changing education and career development to grow, connect and inspire the tech talent community across the Silicon Prairie.

Our educational programs provide vital learning experiences and mentoring to grow future tech talent, and our career development services deliver inspirational, leading edge training and career resources dedicated to advancing and converting talent into tech. Together with our community partners, in 2018 we:

- Connected more than 11,700 youth to STEM education programs in local elementary, middle and high schools;
- Grew the local tech talent community by converting nearly 300 people into IT careers through our Interface Web School programs and Tech Concierge services;
- Inspired more than 3,000 tech professionals through our HDC and Infotec conferences, IT leadership academies, Tech Celebration awards ceremony, and events hosted at The Exchange in downtown Omaha.



Set Your AIM is a career exploration launchpad for anyone thinking about a future in technology. The site targets two distinct audiences along the tech talent pipeline: students and professionals. Offering career path assessment tools, summaries of different tech job categories, an education planner, and a personalized concierge service that connects users to experienced AIM Institute career coaches for one-on-one guidance, Set Your AIM is perfect for students and career changers.

Brain Exchange

The AIM Brain Exchange is our answer to the long-term stability of the tech talent pipeline and a route for under resourced youth to realize a career in STEAM. We believe that the development of the workforce begins in childhood, and we start by engaging our youngest students in authentic, reallife projects rich with creativity and the application of technology. The facility is home to free STEAM learning experiences for youth, ages 7 to 17.


